### Notice

Some students have approached the Dean complaining that relocation of Centre is causing hardship to them and requesting that they be repatriated to their earlier Centre.

There is no *prima facie* case for this complaint as students of all the three Law Centres study the same courses, read common syllabus and case materials, and take the common exam. Presently all the three Law Centres are located within walking distance in North Campus of Delhi University. LL.B. is a three year full time post-graduate professional course in Delhi University and the classes for the same may be scheduled at any time from 8 am – 7 pm as per the Bar Council of India Legal Education Rules 2008. It is reiterated that the relocation was done at the end of all admission so that the block allocation of Centres done at the time of generation of Admission Lists was corrected to ensure allocation of Centre as per students' merit in Entrance Test, their preference, and availability of seats in the given category.

However, in view of genuine difficulties faced by some first year students due to their personal obligations and commitments made since their admission in a particular Centre, it has been decided to examine individual applications from students facing genuine difficulties. Applications for return to CLC from LC-II or vice versa will not be entertained as the class timings are the same for both these Centres and they are located within walking distance of each other. No group applications demanding roll back will be examined. Merely because you had attended classes in the earlier Centre since your admission is not considered a genuine grievance.

The Vice Chancellor had constituted the Students Faculty Committee last year consisting of the elected Presidents and top rankers in the Faculty of Law to a) meet periodically to discuss the state of facilities, including reading material and library resources; and b) discuss with the Dean and Professor-in-Charges, if there are any issues related to improvement in teaching and learning at the Faculty of Law

The Students Faculty Committee has been reconstituted for the academic year 2017-18. (See, Law Faculty website) A meeting of the reconstituted Students Faculty Committee has been scheduled to be held on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2017 to examine this issue and to suggest remedial measures within the framework of applicable rules.

The Students Faculty Committee will examine the individual applications from those students who are facing genuine difficulties due to issues related to timings with the relocation on 1<sup>st</sup> Sept. 2017. The application must contain their specific grievance and should be supported by relevant documents. No application received by the office of Dean, Faculty of Law after 5 pm on 11<sup>th</sup> September 2017 will be examined. Submission of an application does not guarantee restoration of the earlier Centre.
